REBECCA WARNER

ADVANCE Principal Investigator (2016-17) Professor, Sociology

Becky Warner is a Professor in the School of Public Policy at Oregon State University and currently serves as PI for OREGON STATE ADVANCE. From 2009 to 2015 she served as the Senior Vice Provost

for Academic Affairs coordinating programs to advance equity for faculty, including a salary compression program for tenure line faculty, the creation of OSU's first category and compensation framework for professional faculty, and the establishment of additional promotional ranks for fixed term faculty. She created OSU's Office of Work Life and was the founding director of the Greater Oregon Higher Education Recruitment Consortium. Becky is the recipient of many university awards including the Elizabeth Ritchie Distinguished Professor Award and the 2016 Award for Mentoring and Professional Development.



SUSAN SHAW

ADVANCE Co-Principal Investigator (On Sabbatical 2016-2017) Professor, Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies

Susan is in her 19th year at Oregon State University, and her background is in religious studies. Susan has done research in women and HIV/AIDS and women and rock 'n' roll, but her current research interests are in

feminist studies in religion. Susan's most recent book is *Reflective Faith: A Theological Toolbox for Women*, a book and workbook that make feminist theology and feminist biblical criticism accessible for a general audience. Susan is currently working with a group of feminist scholars to co-edit a two volume anthology of essays on Baptist women. She also executive editor of a forthcoming encyclopedia of women's lives worldwide.

After completing engineering degrees at Purdue University (B.S., 1989) and Cornell University (Ph.D., 1994), Michelle joined Oregon State University with teaching and research interests in bioengineering. She has contributed to new program development and to improvement of engineering curricula, leading efforts to integrate engineering ethics and social justice topics in a compelling way. More recently, she has held administrative and leadership appointments that contribute to OSU's commitment to the ongoing transformation of institutional inclusivity, equity and social justice. Her



current research engages in uncovering and disrupting problematic ideologies embedded in engineering culture that contribute to the engineering profession's slow progress towards equity, inclusivity and justice.
